1. Call to Order – Roll Call

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Rob Marlowe at 7:00 pm. Those in attendance were, Deputy Mayor Bill Phillips, Councilwoman Judy DeBella Thomas, Councilman Jeff Starkey and Councilman Chopper Davis.

5 Proclamation - Small Business Saturday

Mayor Marlowe read the proclamation by title only.

6 Proclamation - National Family Caregivers Month

Mayor Marlowe read the proclamation declaring the month of November as National Family Caregivers Month. Elder Law Attorney David Hook was present to receive the parchment from Mayor Marlowe.

7 Vox Pop for Items Not Listed on the Agenda or Listed on Consent Agenda

Mayor Marlowe opened the floor for public comment. Rob Coykendall came forward to address Council that the neighborhood in which he lives seems to have gone downhill over the last few years. He stated it seems that Code Enforcement is being harder on homeowners than landlords. He stated he needed to wait a couple of weeks and had to hire an arborist to remove a tree that was damaged by lightning. He stated his neighbor is running a auto salvage business from his home at 7315 Astor Drive. Councilman Starkey addressed some of Mr. Coykendall's concerns as he is a neighbor of his. No one else coming forward, Mayor Marlowe closed Vox Pop.

Motion was made to accept the Consent Agenda.

- 9 <u>Public Reading of Ordinances</u>
- a Second Reading, Ordinance #2016-2091 Relating to Noise

City Attorney Driscoll read the proposed ordinance by title only. Upon opening the floor to public comment, no one came forward therefore Mayor Marlowe returned the floor to Council. Councilman Starkey asked if businesses had been notified and Chief Bogart responded that yes he had given a draft copy of the ordinance to the downtown businesses. Deputy Mayor Phillips asked for clarification that this ordinance will be a tool that the police can use so that residents can enjoy their property more and Chief Bogart responded that the police went through two processes to find a benchmark to go from. He stated that he knew what other areas noise levels were in regards to commercial areas. He stated that earlier this year the police had gone around with a decibel reader at different times of the night in different areas to measure the readings over a fifteen minute period. Chief Bogart then gave a summary to Council of the readings. Deputy Mayor Phillips asked if there had been any pushback and Chief Bogart responded no. Councilman Davis stated his concern was with Dulcet and Cavaliere Square. He believed that this was a good starting point. Councilwoman DeBella Thomas stated that the river helps to carry the sound from events in the park. She believed that this was a good starting point as well. Chief Bogart clarified that the noise ordinance would not pertain to events in the park because those events were approved by Council and have set time limits for the concerts. Mayor Marlowe stated he thought this was a good starting point and at some point would like to address decibel levels in the concert circles in the park. Motion was made to approve the ordinance upon its second and final reading.

a Waste Hauling Franchise Fee Percentage and Agreement Form Resolution No. 2017-02-Consideration for approval

City Attorney Driscoll read the resolution by title only. Upon opening the floor to public comment, no one came forward therefore Mayor Marlowe returned the floor to Council. Deputy Mayor Phillips wanted to stress that the funds from this are going toward street repairs and not the general fund. He stated that a conversation needs to occur in the future where the city can go to a one hauler system. Councilwoman DeBella Thomas asked for clarification on the Progressive recycling issue and Ms. Manns stated that it had been taken care of. Motion was made to approve the item as presented.

City Manager Manns introduced the item to Council. She stated that the purpose of the agenda item was to renew the waste hauler applications. Upon opening the floor to public comment, no one came forward therefore Mayor Marlowe returned the floor to Council. Motion was made to approve the item as presented.

Motion made by Bill Phillips and seconded by Judy DeBella Thomas. The Motion Passed. 5-0. Ayes: Davis, DeBella Thomas, Marlowe, Phillips, Starkey

c 2016/2017 Sanitary Sewer Gravity Lining Project

City Manager Manns introduced the item to Council. She stated the purpose of this agenda item was to approve the sanitary sewer gravity main rehabilitation. Ms. Manns identified the different areas which would be included in this project. Upon opening the floor to public comment, no one came forward therefore Mayor Marlowe returned the floor to Council. Deputy Mayor Phillips that some digging would be required and Mr. Rivera stated that typically there is no digging that work is done through the manhole Mr. Rivera stated that this will also help with the stormwater around Magnolia Valley. Mayor Marlowe asked about the thickness of the liner and the flow once it is installed. Mr. Rivera stated that the pipe may be smaller the velocity will increase. Councilwoman DeBella Thomas asked what the timeline and price was based on and Mr. Rivera stated that it was a standard estimate from bids from other areas. Motion was made to approve the item as presented.

d 2016/2017 Stormwater Lining Project

City Manager Manns introduced the item to Council. She stated the purpose of this item was for stormwater pipe lining. Upon opening the floor to public comment, no one came forward therefore Mayor Marlowe returned the floor to Council. Motion was made to approve the item as presented.

e Request to Purchase Two P-25 Compliant Dispatch Consoles

City Manager Manns introduced the item to Council. She stated the county is requiring upgrades to radio equipment to be P-25 compliant. Upon opening the floor to public comment, no one came forward therefore Mayor Marlowe returned the floor to Council. Motion was made to approve the item as presented.

Motion made by Chopper Davis and seconded by Jeff Starkey. The Motion Passed. 4-0. Ayes: Davis, DeBella Thomas, Marlowe, Starkey Absent: Phillips

f Request to Consider for Approval Resolution No. 2017-03 - Purchase of Lakewood Villas Utilities, Inc. and Advisor Enterprises, Inc.

City Attorney Driscoll read the resolution by title only. City Manager Manns introduced Public Works Director Robert Rivera who then presented the item to Council. The three utilities are all within the city's water service area. Mr. Rivera stated that discussions with the owners began in 2015 and valuation reports were completed in January 2016. The agreed purchase price that Council approved in April was \$600,000 with a meter upgrade of \$261,000. Mr. Rivera then addressed previous requests for information from Council including a financial review and comparable sales. He stated that a 4% rate increase annually was recommended.

Upon opening the floor to public comment, no one came forward therefore Mayor Marlowe returned the floor to Council. Councilman Davis asked about expanding the service are and Mr. Rivera stated no. He asked about reclaimed water and Mr. Rivera stated that was available. Deputy Mayor Phillips

stated that he was concerned that staff would be able to meet the ninety day timeline for the installation of the new meters. He was concerned that there are hidden problems that will be encountered. Deputy Mayor Phillips asked why is the city not borrowing the funds from ourselves instead of going through debt service. Mr. Rivera stated that the city is currently trying to do its million dollar projects throughout the city moving south. He stated that a sufficiency study would be done to cover the period since the last one was done in 2013. He stated he was concerned what this will do to the debt level and what will happen with Gulf Harbors next year. Deputy Mayor Phillips asked if acquiring these utilities would aid in annexing these areas into the city and City Attorney Driscoll stated that yes this will help. Motion was made to approve the item as presented.

g Resolution No. 2017-04 - Proposed Utility System Extension - Consideration for Approval

City Attorney Driscoll read the resolution by title only. Nikki Nate with Bryant Miller Olive addressed Council on the steps needed to move forward towards closing. Upon opening the floor to public comment, no one came forward therefore Mayor Marlowe returned the floor to Council. Motion was made to approve the item as presented.

She stated that the purpose of this agenda item was to cap attorney's fees for workers' compensation claims. She stated that the workers' comp rates incurred over a fourteen percent increase. Upon opening the floor to public comment, no one came forward therefore Mayor Marlowe returned the floor to Council. Motion was made to approve the item as presented.

i Board Appointment: Elizabeth Giordano, Parks and Recreation Advisory Board

City Manager Manns introduced the item to Council. She stated that Ms. Giordano had submitted an application to be an alternate on the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board. Upon opening the floor to public comment, no one came forward therefore Mayor Marlowe returned the floor to Council. Motion was made to approve the item as presented.

Deputy Mayor Phillips stated he will not be here for the December 6th meeting. He thanked Ms.

Manns and Mr. Murphy for attending the TBRPC Open House on Monday. He stated he would forward the link to the Youtube video played before the Council meeting. He stated there will be things to look at over the next six to eight months in regards to the recent passing of Amendment 2. He stated he was still not happy with the situation on Drinkard Drive. He was interested to see the draft of the dog dining ordinance. He thanked Councilman Starkey for the use of his boat for the Christmas parade. He would like to get an update on renaming the bridge after Dr. Grassin. He also thanked the County for the great Upcycle event in the park over the last weekend. He also thanked the neighbors on Park Drive for the invitation to their block party.

Councilman Starkey stated he agreed with Deputy Mayor on the situation on Drinkard Drive however he did not believe the structure qualified as a seawall. He stated that after seeing all the unrest throughout the country he expressed his appreciation for working with the fellow councilmembers.

She sat in on a meeting in Port Richey by the Bayou Business Association that was a grassroots campaign for activities that they would like to partner with the City's Main Street Program on. She said although local government seems to move at a slow pace it was nice to see that crime has been decreasing and we are in a better place of where we were. She said she looked forward to continued cooperation with the two groups. She also reiterated Councilman Starkey's comments that it is a pleasure to serve with the fellow councilmembers.

Mayor Marlowe stated he thought that the dog dining was already allowed and thanked Councilman Davis for bringing this to their attention. He asked for an update to the injured participant during the Cotteeman. He stated that he would like to see a consolidated calendar of all the events throughout the city. He also thanked the fellow councilmembers for being a pleasure to work with. He advised that he did file to run for re-election.

PARKS & RECREATION BOARD MEETING

October 11, 2016

The regular meeting of the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board was called to order at the Recreation & Aquatic Center at 7:30am on Tuesday, October 11, 2016. Chairman David Schrader, and Board Members Carolyn Marlowe, Greg Giordano, Dana Suiters, Justin Billings, Joy Phillips, Rob Oman, and staff liaison Elaine Smith were in attendance.

The September 13, 2016 meeting minutes were unanimously approved. A hand-out was distributed to all members from the FRPA publication; two articles written concerning the NPR P & R department/Recreation & Aquatic Center/Sims Park.

OLD BUSINESS:

- River Clean-up (175 volunteers & 42 by watercraft) We had the largest number of water craft ever for help with the clean-up; we appreciate all of the assistance from the Advisory Board Members that were able to be there.
- Comic Book Convention The event went very well; the event Organizer
 was happy with the attendance (estimated 2,300) and with the number of
 vendors that participated (65); and wants to have the event at the RAC
 again.
- Star Wars Invasion of Sims Park There were 4 volunteers dressed as Star Wars characters; about 600 giveaways were handed out to children; there was a mock news story on the video board; the movie followed the Invasion.
- Trolley Tour of Parks Thank you all for participating. There was brief discussion about the dumping at River Drive Park; some suggested solutions included installation of security cameras, "No Dumping" signs, and a fence.
- Master Plan Status A firm has been selected, and representatives from the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board, Youth Advisory Board, and other groups will be on the Steering Committee.
- Recreation & Aquatic Center Expansion Status Quotes will be presented to City Council; will decide what can be included at a future Council Meeting.
- Fee Resolution Status All fees were on the list (existing, recommended, proposed), and fee revisions were not approved. Going to re-visit fees and present again.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Hand-outs regarding articles published in the FRPA Journal The FRPA
 Journal is distributed state-wide. The Agency Profile is from an interview
 with Elaine. The other article was written by Elaine; the timing of the
 publication was excellent; Parks are what attract people to the City and
 our City Council Members get that. Sims Park was selected as the Facility
 Showcase and there will be an article about that published in the
 December issue.
- Gymnasium Floors The wood floors were refurbished and the building is airing out now. A three-point line for college has been added to the basketball courts.
- Informal Survey during Event A survey was done during the Comic Con Event (a newer, different crowd). Some had never been here, some had been here for something, but don't attend regularly. All said they plan to return to the RAC and made positive comments about it.
- Dana needs a new P & R Advisory Board member shirt. Elizabeth Giordano, who is a Youth Advisory Board Alumni, is interested in filling one of the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board alternate spots.

SPECIAL EVENTS

- Kids Zombie Fun Run is this Saturday morning at the James E Grey Preserve. Dave and Joy said they would volunteer to assist.
- Cornhole Tournament is planned for this Saturday at the Recreation & Aquatic Center.
- Trunk or Treat at Orange Lake on October 22nd We expect at least 2,000 participants; we have requested police support.
- Family Movie Night will follow at Sims Park; beginning at 7:pm. the movie will be "Hocus Pocus".
- The Puppy Paddle will be at the Recreation & Aquatic Center on October 29th.
- Cardboard Campout will be held at the Recreation & Aquatic Center on November 19th.

VOX POP

A photo was taken in front of the Trolley; Elaine sent it to Judy Meyers. There was discussion about restrooms not being stocked and garbage cans overflowing during special events (The event organizer is supposed to have volunteers assist with emptying garbage cans; only two grounds maintenance workers are scheduled to work during special events).

A new photo of the Advisory Board Members was taken in front of the Recreation & Aquatic Center.

There was a question about the cost of the video board(s) at Sims Park amphitheatre; the IT Department puts the information on them.

Next meeting will be held Tuesday, November 8th at 7:30am.

The meeting was then adjourned at 8:10am.

TROLLEY TOUR OF CITY PARKS MEETING

October 8, 2016

All Parks & Recreation Advisory Board Members; Dave Schrader, Carolyn Marlowe, Justin Billings, Dana Suiters, Rob Oman, Greg Giordano, Joy Phillips, and some Parks & Recreation Youth Advisory Board Members; Jeremy, Josh, Chris, Alex, and Angel were in attendance. Some guests accompanied the members, including Stacey & Elizabeth Giordano & Helen Caravona, in addition to Parks and Recreation Director, Elaine Smith, Mayor Rob Marlowe, and City Clerk, Judy Meyers.

The main purpose of the meeting is to take a brief tour of many of the City Parks to become more familiar with their location and the existing amenities. All in attendance were given paper on which to write notes and suggestions while on the tour; which will be considered in the Master Plan for the Parks.

Beginning of the Tour:

- Participants met at Frances Ave. Park around 7:45am. Everyone walked down to the ADA Kayak Launch/Dock.
- The Trolley and driver was provided at no cost to the City by Friendly Kia.
- A photo was taken of the group in attendance before boarding the Trolley.
- Clipboards with paper and pen was handed to each person as they boarded the Trolley. Cold drinks and water were available during the meeting.
- Verbal suggestions were made to have more swings/infant swings added to some of the parks, if possible. The cement boat ramp at Frances Ave needs to have a road put in leading up to it (there are several trees blocking the way at present).

Frances Avenue Park to Grey Preserve:

- From Frances Avenue Park, the Trolley went to the James E Grey Preserve. Plathe Rd. has been paved and speed humps installed to deter drivers from speeding.
- Everyone got off the Trolley at James E Grey Preserve and walked to the Kayak Launch/Dock. The cement has not yet been poured for ADA parking and access to the launch.

 Everyone re-boarded the Trolley and rode to the walking trails and playground. Other amenities include picnic shelters, restrooms, nature viewing tower and boardwalk.

North Entry to Grey Preserve:

 The Trolley exited the James E Grey Preserve to Louisiana Ave. and Congress St. to see the north entrance parcel recently purchased. Using grants, plans to have connecting walking trails, bike paths, a boardwalk, and possibly a nature viewing tower are being considered for this beautiful area.

The Meadows Dog Park:

- From Louisiana Ave. to Madison St., down Cecelia Ave. to Larch Lane, the Trolley stopped at the entrance of the Meadows Dog Park.
- Elaine told everyone that the park used to be a hangout and that since the dog park and other improvements were completed in 2008, families can now enjoy using the park.
- Everyone got off the Trolley and walked in to see the amenities. In addition to the fenced dog areas, there is a picnic area, playground, restrooms, basketball court, a nature walk and a shelter by the river (from which the Grey Preserve may be seen).
- Some comments and suggestions made included trimming the tree roots along the nature path and building a connecting bridge across the river to the Grey Preserve.

Kulhawik Park:

- From the Meadows, the Trolley proceeded back down Cecelia Ave., past Marlowe Elementary School, to Grand Blvd. Kulhawik Park is a vacant lot near the old HCA Community Hospital.
- The land may only be developed for park usage or left open. Comments were made that it might be a good location to put a Skate Park.

Grand Blvd Park:

 The Trolley proceeded down Grand Blvd. and stopped at Grand Blvd. Park. Amenities include a dock, access to the river, a picnic shelter, restrooms, and a playground. Comments were made that children have been seen playing on the playground at 7:30am during the weekdays, and that a shade structure is soon to be added over the playground; it is exposed to the sun during the heat of the day.

Russ Park:

- The Trolley proceeded down Gulf Dr., to US 19, to Avery Rd. Russ Park consists of an old playground that is not used by neighborhood children due to it having become a hangout.
- Comments were made to get rid of the playground, sell the property, or put a garden there.

Sims Park Boat Ramp:

- From US 19, the Trolley moved on to Main St. to River Rd. and past the Chamber of Commerce. The Sims Park Boat Ramp (double ramp) needs to be extended out so vehicles don't fall off the ramp at low tide. There is a new Kayak Launch in Sims Park.
- The Overlook is being looked at to make it a useful space; some possibilities include renting kayaks, an informational kiosk, refreshment stand, etc.

Jasmin Park:

- The Trolley proceeded down River Rd. through the subdivisions to Jasmin Park. Comments were made that the street signs need to be changed due to misspelling of "Jasmin".
- Comments were made that there is no parking area, but there is potential
 to add swings and possibly a picnic shelter to the site overlooking the
 river.

Other Small Parks:

- The Trolley then drove to River Drive Park, which is simply an open parcel
 of land near the river.
- An area was observed where yard debris was being dumped; comments were made that it could be developed into something nice for the neighborhood.
- The Trolley then proceeded back to Frances Avenue Park.

Vox Pop:

Discussion on the way back to Frances Avenue Park included that Way-Finding Signs are already being planned, a Steering Committee is being formed to attend meetings regarding the 10-year Master Plan for the City Parks; Dave, Carolyn, and Joy said they would most likely be able and willing to attend those meetings. Youth Advisory Board Members Alex, Chris, and Alumni Member, Elizabeth, stated they would also be able to go to the meetings.

All were encouraged to go to Pine Hill Park at their leisure to observe and become familiar with that park, as well.

All papers (and clipboards) with ideas and comments were collected as everyone disembarked the Trolley at 9:50am. All were encouraged to bring their ideas regarding open play space, picnic shelters, playgrounds, grills, etc. to the Master Plan meetings.

Rezoning - 6705 Jackson Street

REQUEST:

Council is to conduct a first public hearing of the ordinances under the quasi-judicial proceedings.

DISCUSSION:

Proposal:

The hospital proposes to expand its parking with the inclusion of the subject site. In order to add this piece to the overall campus, a land use plan amendment and rezoning is required. The Planned Development District (PDD) zoning requires simultaneous site plan approval.

The proposal amends the existing PDD zoning with development standards that coincide with the changes to the site plan. The proposed Public-Semi/Public land use category and Planned Development District zoning will match that of the bulk of the hospital land.

Concurrency Review:

To ensure that the rezoning will meet concurrency standards, an availability and demand analysis is performed for the maximum potential development. Concurrency is determined by comparing the available capacity of a public facility/service with the total demand of the subject site, which is measured by determining the potential demand minus the demand generated by the existing uses.

Traffic:

The Land Development Code requires a transportation study for proposed projects that generate more than 50 trips per day in the PM peak hour of operation. The hospital does not propose to add more beds at this facility due to this request. No traffic study is needed.

Sanitary Sewer:

Sanitary sewer treatment will be provided by the City's wastewater treatment facility, which is designed to handle 7.5 million gallons per day (gpd). From the 7.5 million gpd, Pasco County is allotted a capacity of 3.0 million gpd, which leaves the City with a capacity of 4.5 million gpd. The total daily flow is approximately 5.0 million gpd, allowing for a 2.5 million gpd surplus capacity.

The proposed rezoning is expected to generate no change to the current demand of 17,328 gpd which is serviceable by the City. The proposed rezoning does not include the addition of more beds, therefore will not impact the City's sewer level of service.

Potable Water:

The City of New Port Richey will provide water service and the City is supplied water by Tampa Bay Water. The present design of the City's water treatment facility is 11.1 million gpd. The approximate average daily flow is 3.5 million gpd with a surplus of 7.6 million gpd.

The proposed rezoning is expected to generate no change to the current demand of 23,104 gpd for residential uses and 1,364 gpd for commercial uses which is serviceable by the City. The proposed rezoning does not include the addition of more beds, therefore will not impact the City's potable water level of service.

Solid Waste:

The City does not provide solid waste service. This is provided through franchise agreements with independent haulers. The City has an inter-local agreement with Pasco County for solid waste disposal and the County is responsible for providing adequate dumping sites.

Drainage:

The City handles drainage demand through the development review process at the time such development occurs. Post-development drainage patterns cannot exceed pre-development patterns. Run-off from the proposed parking lot is anticipated to flow northeast to the existing retention pond.

Recreation:

According to the adopted level of service for future recreation needs (Table 5, Recreation and Open Space Elements, Comprehensive Plan), the City of New Port Richey has a surplus of facilities for a population of 20,000 and over, depending on the type of facility. Because the proposal is for a commercial use, it should have no affect on recreation levels of service.

Fire & Emergency Medical Services:

Fire and emergency medical services will be provided to this property by Station #1 is located at 6333 Madison Street. The Fire Department will continue to serve this property and the rezoning will not adversely affect fire and EMS service and response time.

Police:

The City of New Port Richey administers police service. There are currently 42 officers that offer police protection to the residents of the City. Community policing service will be provided through the City's zone system and officers in the field.

Compatibility with Comprehensive Plan:

The proposal will be consistent with the following Comprehensive Plan objectives and policies:

- Future Land Use Map, C.7.a The Public/Semi-Public Category recognizes identifiable areas of the community which support public, municipal and semi-public community services and facilities.
- Policy 1.3.2 Commercial development shall be of a type, as defined in the land development regulations, which is intended to serve the general retail day-to-day commercial needs (e.g. convenience goods and services), and personal and professional service needs of the residents of the City of New Port Richey, seasonal visitors to this community and the surrounding unincorporated County.
- Objective 1.4 The City shall encourage the use of the planned unit development (the intent of which is to provide flexible standards and development and guidelines while maintaining and protecting the desired community character) for future development and, as appropriate, redevelopment activities.
- Policy 1.4.3 The planned unit development regulations shall address an allowance for zero lot line cluster or other non-traditional lot layout or site design; the identification of restrictions on permitted or conditional land uses within the district; the establishment of minimum acreage and dimensional requirements, minimal design, landscaping/buffering and illumination criteria.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of the ordinances. The Land Development Review Board recommend approval at its November 17, 2016 meeting, subject to the condition that a unit of title application is completed, adding the site at 6705 Jackson Street to the master parcel.


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




Figure 4.4c. Double Row Stelled Sift Fence Some Resy Case Represent Dates.









Figure 4.3c. Construction Entrance with Wash Rack PLEASE NOTE ALL ASSOCIATED HAY BALE DETAILS AND ASSOCIATED NOTES ARE NOT TO BE USED.

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

II. Approval of Minutes:

Mr. Grey chaired the meeting. Dr. Cadle made the motion to approve the October 20, 2016 minutes as presented which was seconded by Ms. Moran. The motion carried and the Board approved the minutes (6-0).

III. Land Use Plan Amendment LUP2016-03 & Rezoning Application REZ2016-04

Case: Land Use Plan Amendment LUP2016-03 & Rezoning Application REZ2016-04 –

Morton Plant Hospital Parking Area

(Ordinance #2017-2100).

Mr. Karpas provided a powerpoint presentation. He noted the property at 6705 Jackson Street currently contains a vacant single-family home. He said that the hospital proposes to expand its parking with the inclusion of the subject site. In order to add this piece to the overall campus, a land use plan amendment and rezoning are required. He noted that the proposed Public-Semi/Public land use category and Planned Development District zoning district will be consistent with the remainder of the hospital property. He noted that a unity of title will be required, adding the 6705 Jackson Street property to the master parcel. He noted this is a quasi-judicial hearing.

Mr. Grey asked for clarification about the location of the site. Mr. Karpas and Ms. Fierce located the site on the site plans provided to the Board members.

Mr. Smallwood asked about Phase O.B. as noted in the site plan. Ms. Fierce noted it is a future phase; the area has been rezoned but not yet redeveloped to provide additional parking.

Mr. Smallwood asked if the neighbors had been informed of the request. Mr. Karpas affirmed they had been notified and no comments had been received. He noted the property owners will also receive notice about the City Council hearings.

Deborah Bartley, the hospital construction manager, introduced herself. Ms. Michel questioned why if the proposed use would generate no more than 50 trips per day the additional parking area is required. Ms. Bartley explained the hospital meets the Code parking requirements and with the campus improvements, there has been a net loss of parking spaces. The hospital is shifting employee parking to this more remote location in order to provide parking for the public closer to the hospital. Ms. Fierce explained that the language in the staff report was a reference to a transportation concurrency threshold and the proposal is too insignificant to require a traffic study.

Mr. Grey asked if the increase in impervious surface has been reviewed. Ms. Bartley said the impervious surface ratio has been reviewed and meets the Code standard.

Mr. Smallwood expressed concern that this request would result in a loss of tax revenue for the City. Ms. Fierce noted that this was true for the site, but the hospital improvements are beneficial for the City and may encourage development elsewhere providing additional tax revenue. Mr. Grey praised the improvements to the hospital campus.

Dr. Cadle made the motion to recommend approval of the land use plan amendment which was seconded by Ms. Moran. Roll call vote: Moran, yes; Michel, yes; Grey, yes; Smallwood, yes; Cadle, yes; and MacDonald, yes. The motion carried 6-0.

Dr. Cadle made the motion to recommend approval of the rezoning, subject to the condition that a unity of title application is completed, adding the site at 6705 Jackson to the master parcel, which was seconded by

Ms. Moran. Roll call vote: MacDonald, yes; Cadle, yes; Smallwood, yes; Grey, yes; Michel, yes; and Moran, yes. The motion carried 6-0.

IV. Adjourn:

Ms. Fierce thanked the Board Members for attending the meeting and congratulated Ms. Moran on having been reappointed to the Board at the City Council's most recent meeting. She wished the members a Happy Thanksgiving and said the next meeting of the Board will be December 15th.

On August 30, 2016 a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) was let for alternate Special Magistrate services. Two proposals were received by staff in response to the RFQ; one from Ms. Barrie Buenaventura and one from Mr. Christian Waugh. Both candidates were interviewed for the position on November 21, 2016. After the interviews, it was clear that Ms. Buenaventura was an ideal candidate for this position. SPECIAL MAGISTRATE SERVICES CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT made December 1, 2015, by and between the PINELLAS COUNTY CONSTRUCTION LICENSING BOARD, hereinafter referred to as "PCCLB," and BARRIE BUENAVENTURA, Pennington, P.A. hereinafter referred to as "SPECIAL MAGISTRATE."

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. SPECIAL MAGISTRATE, by executing this agreement warrants that he is fully qualified to perform the function of SPECIAL MAGISTRATE as prescribed herein, and that SPECIAL MAGISTRATE is a member in good standing of the Florida Bar, and that he has not been disciplined by the Florida bar or the bar of any other jurisdiction.
- 2. The contract term shall be for two years commencing January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2017, this agreement shall be renewed for an additional one-year term at the discretion of the Executive Director of the PCCLB. PCCLB may terminate this agreement at any time by furnishing written notice of its intent to terminate ten (10) days prior to the actual date of termination.
- 3. At commencement of the contract, SPECIAL MAGISTRATE hereby agrees to perform the services of a hearing officer, hearing and deciding all cases assigned to him by the PCCLB involving alleged violations of the Pinellas County Code of Ordinances provisions, the PCCLB Special Act, and general laws, as they may be amended from time to time. The PCCLB administrative staff shall be responsible for scheduling meetings of Special Magistrates. SPECIAL MAGISTRATE shall be required to hear all matters assigned to him through completion and work with PCCLB staff and be prepared to issue findings of fact and conclusions of law and final recommended orders in acceptable form for ratification by the PCCLB.
- 4. The location of the meetings shall be in Pinellas County, Florida. PCCLB shall provide an appropriate location to conduct the proceedings. Travel reimbursement is limited to expenses incurred only for travel outside Pinellas County necessary to fulfill the responsibilities as a Special Magistrate. Travel reimbursements shall be made only when sufficient funds have been budgeted and are available, and upon prior approval by the PCCLB Board. No

PCCLB staff to fulfill the responsibilities as a Special Magistrate. All typical office and overhead expenses including, but not limited to local telephone expenses, travel, recreational, and copies of documents, shall be borne by SPECIAL MAGISTRATE.

5. SPECIAL MAGISTRATE shall be paid the sum of \$150.00 dollars per hour for each hour or fraction thereof for services rendered. Payment by PCCLB shall be in compliance with the Florida Prompt Payment Act as it may be amended from time to time. SPECIAL MAGISTRATE shall not be prohibited from handling privately retained cases in his private practice so long as it does not otherwise interfere with SPECIAL MAGISTRATE'S obligations under this agreement. SPECIAL MAGISTRATE shall promptly notify PCCLB of any ethical conflicts that may arise or if for some reason SPECIAL MAGISTRATE feels it would be inappropriate for him to hear and deliberate any given individual's alleged violation.

Additionally, the SPECIAL MAGISTRATE shall comply with the following conflict of interest provisions of this section; failure to comply with these provisions shall constitute grounds for removal by the PCCLB or the Executive Director:

- A. Upon appointment, each Special Magistrate shall comply with the disclosure requirements imposed by Florida law, including sections 112.313 and 112.3145, Florida Statutes.
- B. Additionally, each Special Magistrate shall comply with the voting requirements imposed by Florida law, including sections 286.012 and 112.3143, Florida Statutes.
- C. For a period of one (1) year from the date of termination of office as a Special Magistrate, such person is hereby expressly prohibited from acting as agent or attorney in any proceedings, petition or other matter before a PCCLB Special Magistrate.
- D. No person who is or may become a party to a hearing before a Special Magistrate shall communicate ex parte with any Special Magistrate concerning that violation. This restriction shall extend to any person appearing or interceding on behalf of a party, whether or not such person may have a direct personal or financial interest in the property subject of the alleged violation.
- E. A Special Magistrate shall not communicate ex parte on his own volition with any party, representative of a party, or interceding person concerning an alleged violation; however, the Special Magistrate may consider a

request regarding the scheduling or continuance of hearings when such request is made in writing.

- SPECIAL MAGISTRATE shall have the right, with the approval of COUNTY, to 6. adopt rules for the conduct of any hearing before SPECIAL MAGISTRATE so long as the rules are in compliance with any governing statute, rule, or ordinance. PCCLB and SPECIAL MAGISTRATE intend that the relationship between them created by this contract is that SPECIAL MAGISTRATE is an independent contractor. No agent, employee, or servant of the SPECIAL MAGISTRATE shall be or shall be deemed to be, the agent or servant of PCCLB. None of the benefits provided by PCCLB to their employees including, but not limited to Worker's Compensation Insurance and Unemployment Insurance are available from PCCLB to the employees, agents, or servants of SPECIAL MAGISTRATE. SPECIAL MAGISTRATE shall be solely and entirely responsible for his tortious acts and for the tortious acts of his agents, employees, or servants during the performance of this contract. If permitted by law SPECIAL MAGISTRATE shall be allowed to partake of the benefits of sovereign immunity by Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, as it may be amended from time to time. This is not an exclusive contract and does not guarantee SPECIAL MAGISTRATE will receive a minimum payment each month or that he will have cases to be heard each month or duties to perform. Further, PCCLB reserves the right to hire other individuals as SPECIAL MAGISTRATES during the term of this agreement.
- 7. SPECIAL MAGISTRATE signing this agreement shall perform the legal services described herein. At no time shall an associate or substitute counsel perform the SPECIAL MAGISTRATE services. SPECIAL MAGISTRATE shall not delegate or assign his right or obligations hereunder either in while or part without the prior written consent of PCCLB. SPECIAL MAGISTRATE agrees and covenants that he shall perform the legal services described herein while at all times complying with all the current requirements of the Code of Professional Responsibility and the Disciplinary Rules of the Florida Bar. Any actions by SPECIAL MAGISTRATE or his agents that do not comport with the Code of Professional Responsibility and the Disciplinary Rules of the Florida Bar shall be the sole responsibility and liability of SPECIAL MAGISTRATE.
- 8. PCCLB at its discretion may audit or inspect SPECIAL MAGISTRATE'S books and his financial records, ledgers, time sheets, other records relating to services under this agreement for a period of three (3) years after the termination of this agreement. All records, books, and accounts related to the performance of this agreement shall be subject to the applicable provisions of the Florida Public Records Act, Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

- 9. SPECIAL MAGISTRATE agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless COUNTY, its agents, employees, and officers from and against all liabilities, claims, demands, or actions at law and equity including court costs and attorney's fees that may hereafter at any time be made or brought by anyone for the purpose of enforcing a claim on account of any injury or damage allegedly caused or occurring to any person or property in which was caused in whole or in part by any tortious, wrongful, or intentional acts or omissions of SPECIAL MAGISTRATE, his agents, or employees during performance under this agreement.
- 10. The failure of SPECIAL MAGISTRATE to comply with the terms of this agreement shall constitute a material breach of this agreement by SPECIAL MAGISTRATE. In addition to any remedies authorized by law, PCCLB shall have the right to terminate this agreement immediately upon the occurrence of such material breach. Failure to exercise this right of termination shall not constitute a waiver of such right, which may be exercised at any subsequent time. At the option of the PCCLB, this agreement shall terminate upon the occurrence of any of the following:
 - A. Violation of any material provision of the agreement.
 - B. Discovery by PCCLB that this agreement was obtained through fraud by commission or omission.
 - C. Any assignment of the rights or responsibilities under this agreement without PCCLB approval in writing.
 - The institution of disciplinary proceedings against SPECIAL
 MAGISTRATE by the Florida Bar or any other jurisdiction's professional regulatory body.
 - E. The commencement of criminal prosecution of SPECIAL MAGISTRATE in any court anywhere.
 - F. Failure to disclose to the PCCLB the institution of any criminal or administrative disciplinary proceedings against the SPECIAL MAGISTRATE
 - G. Incompetence, rendering of unsatisfactory service, neglect of duty or any other conduct unbecoming an officer of the court.
- 11. In the event SPECIAL MAGISTRATE is unable to perform under this agreement due to a permanently disabling injury, a continuing disabling sickness, or for other similar causes beyond the control of SPECIAL MAGISTRATE, SPECIAL MAGISTRATE shall be released from any and all obligations under this agreement. In the event circumstances

beyond the control of PCCLB such as a judicial decision, administrative action, or other similar circumstances, prevent PCCLB from fulfilling its obligation under this agreement, SPECIAL MAGISTRATE agrees that in the aforementioned circumstances, PCCLB will be released from any and all responsibility hereunder.

- 12. This agreement is subject to the availability of funds. In the event funds to finance this agreement are unavailable, PCCLB may terminate this agreement upon no less than thirty (30) days after written notice thereof to SPECIAL MAGISTRATE. Said notice shall be delivered by certified mail, return receipt requested, or in person with proof of delivery. PCCLB shall be the final authority as to availability of funds.
- 13. No waiver by either party of any existing default by the other party shall be deemed to waive any subsequent default of such party.
- 14. All rights hereunder are cumulative, not alternative, and are in addition to any other rights given by law.
- 15. This agreement supercedes any prior agreements between the parties and is the sole basis for agreement between the parties.
- 16. Any notice required to be given under any provision of this agreement shall be deemed given if sent to SPECIAL MAGISTRATE at the following address:

This does not preclude notice given by other means but to be effective for purposes of this provision the notice must be given as stated herein. Changes to notice addresses may be made in writing and mailed as noted above or by hand delivery of written notice.

17. This agreement expresses the entire understanding of the parties concerning all matters covered herein. No addition to, or alteration of, the terms of this agreement whether by written or verbal understanding of the parties, their officers, agents or employees shall be valid unless made in the form of a written amendment to this agreement and formally approved by the parties.

The parties ratify the terms and conditions of the Agreement not inconsistent with this Amendment, all of which are incorporated by reference.

Project Understanding

The City of New Port Richey has been awarded a grant for improvements to the James E. Grey Preserve. The following assumptions have been made within this proposal:

- The RT Grant identifies the following improvements to be included in this phase, any additional
 grant funding increasing the scope will result in an amendment to this contract:
 - \$ 40,000 Parking Lot
 - \$190,000 Hard Surface Bicycle Trail
 - \$ 80,000 Walking Trail
 - \$ 60,000 Walking Bridge
 - \$ 5,000 Signage
 - \$ 20,000 Trail Connections
 - \$ 90,000 Improvements for Bicycles to Phase III Upper Trial
 - \$485,000 Total Project Cost
- The above costs are to include the costs of planning, permitting, and site construction document preparation not to exceed 15% of the total project cost.
- It is assumed that the proposed "Walking Bridge" and any boardwalks will be a pre-engineered structure, therefore, structural design services are not included in this Amendment.
- It is assumed that there are no proposed utilities, therefore, utility and electrical design is not

Based on the above information, we have prepared the following Scope of Services:

Scope of Services

TASK 1 - SITE PLANNING AND COORDINATION

This task consists of the following meetings and coordination efforts:

- Site Layout and Planning: Kimley-Horn staff (Civil Engineer and Land Planner) will coordinate
 with the City to develop the site layout. Kimley-Horn will provide input on the site layout options
 produced by the City via two (2) in-person meetings with the City.
- As part of this task Kimley-Horn will coordinate with the surveyor to identify survey locations and review the topographic survey. Kimley-Horn will use this survey as the base for proposed improvements.
- This task consists of coordination with the Geotechnical Engineer and review of the geotechnical report and incorporation of recommendation into Construction Plans.

TASK 2 - SITE CONSTRUCTION DOCUMENTS

This task consists of effort by Kimley-Horn to prepare the following Civil Construction Plans in accordance with the City of New Port Richey Land Development Code.

- Cover Sheet:
- General Notes:
- Demolition Plan;
- Site Plan;
- Details;
- Grading and Drainage Plan;
- Code minimum Landscape (if required limited to areas being disturbed)

Note: There are no proposed utilities at this time. Therefore, utility design, construction document preparation, and permitting is not included in this scope.

This task consists of Kimley-Horn preparing an Engineer's Opinion of Probable Cost (OPC).

Because the Consultant does not control the cost of labor, materials, equipment or services furnished by others, methods of determining prices, or competitive bidding or market conditions, any opinions rendered as to costs, including but not limited to opinions as to the costs of construction and materials, shall be made on the basis of its experience and represent its judgment as an experienced and qualified professional, familiar with the industry. The Consultant cannot and does not guarantee that proposals, bids or actual costs will not vary from its opinions of cost. If the Client wishes greater assurance as to the amount of any cost, it shall employ an independent cost estimator. Consultant's services required to bring costs within any limitation established by the Client will be paid for as Additional Services.

TASK 3 - PERMITTING

This task consists of the preparation and submission of permit applications with supporting documentation and coordination, as required for the Client's contractor to commence land development construction activities. The following list of permits is anticipated in order for the Client's contractor to commence land development construction activities:

- City of New Port Richey Site Plan Review
- Southwest Florida Water Management District ERP

Responding to requests for additional information beyond what is normal and customary, and responding to permitting issues beyond our control are outside of this scope of services and will be provided, as needed, as an Additional Service only after prior written authorization by Owner. Efforts to respond to issues raised during the permitting process, which cannot currently be anticipated, shall be considered Additional Services.

State Environmental Permitting

Kimley-Horn will conduct a site visit to delineate the limits of wetlands so that the proposed walkway and bike trail may be designed to avoid potential wetland impacts if possible. Based on the proposed location of a walking bridge, a sovereign submerged lands lease will be required from the State. Kimley-Horn will prepare the required application materials and obtain the required lease. As part of this application, Kimley-Horn will prepare figures depicting the limits of State Lands and jurisdictional wetlands with the proposed improvements shown, so that potential dredge and fill impacts can be accurately calculated. In addition, Kimley-Horn will quantify the proposed impacts and determine the appropriate amount of wetland mitigation for such impacts. For the purpose of this Task, it is assumed that mitigation can be accomplished through credit purchase at an off-site mitigation bank. If the State requires on-site or permittee responsible mitigation, additional services will be required. While coordination with a surveyor is included in this Task, no surveying services are included in this scope of work. Any design information required by the State for processing stormwater approvals will be completed as a separate task.

Federal Environmental Permitting

Kimley-Horn will use the information gathered during field reconnaissance and submitted to the State to supplement an application for a federal dredge and fill permit. Based on the proposed improvements, it is assumed that a Standard Permit will be required for the proposed wetland impacts because the Pithlachascotee River is tidal and therefore, the project does not qualify for a Nationwide Permit. If impacts can be reduced to less than 1000 square feet over jurisdictional waters, a general permit may be obtained. The project will need to demonstrate a need to fill federally jurisdictional wetlands as well as avoidance and minimization of wetland impacts. It is assumed that wetland credit purchase at an off-site mitigation bank will satisfy the federal mitigation requirements. If additional mitigation design or site selection is required, additional services will be required.

TASK 4 – CONSTRUCTION PHASE SERVICES

Kimley-Horn will provide the following limited construction phase services:

- Assist in Bid Phase Services (8 hours)
- Shop Drawings and Samples. Kimley-Horn will review and approve or take other appropriate
 action in respect to Shop Drawings and Samples and other data which Contractor is required
 to submit, but only for conformance with the information given in the Contract Documents.
 Such review and approvals or other action will not extend to means, methods, techniques,
 equipment choice and usage, sequences, schedules, or procedures of construction or to
 related safety precautions and programs (10 hours).
- Visits to Site and Observation of Construction. Consultant will provide limited on-site construction observation services during the construction phase. Consultant will make up to 5 visits at 4 hours each in order to observe the progress of the Work. Such visits and observations by Consultant are not intended to be exhaustive or to extend to every aspect of Contractor's work in progress. Observations are to be limited to spot checking, selective measurement, and similar methods of general observation of the Work based on Consultant's exercise of

professional judgment. Based on information obtained during such visits and such observations, Consultant will evaluate whether Contractor's work is generally proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents, and Consultant will keep Client informed of the general progress of the Work.

- Review of 'as-built' documents as required by City and SWFWMD, submitted by Contractor, and assist with obtaining final inspections and Certifications of Completion, as required for approval of the project (15 hours).
- Submit Certifications of Completion as required to appropriate agencies (20 hours including site visit).

If the Consultant provides construction phase services, the Consultant shall have no responsibility for any contractor's means, methods, techniques, equipment choice and usage, sequence, schedule, safety programs, or safety practices, nor shall Consultant have any authority or responsibility to stop or direct the work of any contractor. The Consultant's visits shall be for the purpose of endeavoring to provide the Client a greater degree of confidence that the completed work of its contractors will generally conform to the construction documents prepared by the Consultant. Consultant neither guarantees the performance of contractors, nor assumes responsibility for any contractor's failure to perform their work in accordance with the contract documents.

REQUEST:

The request of staff for City Council's review and consideration of approval, is an attached utility easement from Duke Energy Florida, LLC, a Florida Limited Liability Company, d/b/a Duke Energy granting access to the Gloria Swanson parking lot.

DISCUSSION:

As City Council may recall, during the fiscal year of 2014/2015 the City and Duke Energy completed the LED Streetlight Conversion Project. Subsequent to the project completion, New Port Richey became the first city in Pasco County's Duke Energy network to replace all of its streetlights from the high pressure sodium vapor (PSV) elements to light emitting diodes (LEDs). The streetlight replacements were the first phase of a two phase process. The second phase is the conversion of all City owned parking lot lights from the existing PSV to LEDs. During the design phase it was discovered that no utility easement was present for Duke Energy to replace and maintain the light facilities in the City owned Gloria Swanson parking lot located east of Bank St. and south of Grand Blvd. The granting of this utility easement by the City Council would be considered a housekeeping item by staff.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approval of the easement is recommended.

BUDGET/FISCAL IMPACT:

Funds collected by the granting of the easement are considered revenue to the City's general fund.

The request of staff for the City Council is to review the attached New Port Richey Construction Services recommendation memo and to consider approval and award of the lowest bid submitted by Augustine Construction, Inc. in the amount not to exceed \$228,290 for the 2015/2016 (CDBG) Circle Blvd. Improvements Project ITB-16-018.

DISCUSSION:

As City Council may recall, the proposed Circle Blvd. Improvements Project includes the milling of existing pavement, drainage improvements, ADA improvements to the existing sidewalk ramps, asphalt paving, and roadway marking installations.

The project was advertised for competitive bidding on October 8, 2016. Eight (8) competitive bids were opened by the City on November 4, 2016. Stormwater and ADA Improvements Project and currently the Marine Pkwy Multi-Use Path Project. The City's Construction Services Division has reviewed the bid documents required for each submission, contacted references, verified line item dollar amounts, and has submitted a letter of recommendation for bid award based on their review process.

DISCUSSION:

This type of vehicle is used by Water Distribution maintenance staff for routine repairs and emergency repairs such as fire hydrant replacement, large pipe and valve removal and replacement, as well as loading and unloading of large pieces of equipment used in several types of maintenance and repairs of the utility systems. The existing 2003 utility service truck with crane attachment is 16 years old and has served its useful life. 

The action requested of City Council is to review and consider the approval of the attached proposal from Alan Jay Fleet Sales in the amount not to exceed \$58,136.20 for the purchase of one F550 Utility Service Truck and the City's Fleet Maintenance proposal for outfitting in the amount not to exceed \$3,000. The Alan Jay Fleet Sales pricing is in accordance with the National Auto Joint Powers Alliance (NJPA) Bid No. 2017-102811. Approval of the contract is in accordance with the City Finance rules and regulations.

DISCUSSION:

This type of utility service truck is replacing existing service truck that is 11 years old and has served its useful life. Subsequent to the Fleet Maintenance Supervisor's condition review, a recommendation for replacement has been submitted to the Department Head. High maintenance costs, a defective transmission, and numerous other repairs have been identified. This equipment is used by the Water Distribution Division's maintenance staff to respond to daily maintenance activities and emergency repairs throughout the City's water service area. This equipment and body style are the same as specified for all utility service vehicles in our fleet and are consistent with industry standards for this type of work activity.



REQUEST:

The action requested of City Council is to review and consider for approval the attached proposal from Alan Jay Fleet Sales in the amount not to exceed \$25,251.00 for the purchase of one F150 standard pickup truck and the City's Fleet Maintenance proposal for outfitting in the amount not to exceed \$1,919.00. The Alan Jay Fleet Sales pricing is in accordance with the National Auto Joint Powers Alliance (NJPA) Bid No. 2017-10281. Approval of the contract is in accordance with the City's Finance Rules and Regulations.

DISCUSSION:

As Council may recall, subsequent to the completion of the Sims Park Improvements Project additional maintenance personnel were requested and approved by City Council. Maintenance tasks and operational hours justified the staff enlargement. As a result of the projects expected completion time of January 2016, it was determined by staff to delay the request for an additional vehicle until the 2016/2017 fiscal year in an attempt to reduce the budget impact on the general fund. Should City Council approval the purchase, maintenance personnel will not have to share maintenance vehicles transporting each other back to the operations center due to several different shift times as well as different maintenance task which call for each crew to have a maintenance vehicle to perform and complete their tasks.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approval of the purchase is recommended.

Funding for this vehicle is budgeted in the 2016/2017 Capital Equipment/Improvement Plan for the Grounds Maintenance Division account No. 001-0110-539-64-15.



Attached for City Council review and approval is a proposal submitted by Whiteleaf LLC dba Traffic Solutions in an amount not to exceed \$60,000.00 for the application of roadway striping. The pricing is in accordance with Pasco County's Annual Street Markings Contract, Bid #ITB No. IFB-DL-15-125. It is the intent of staff to "Piggy Back" off of the Pasco County Contract in accordance with the City's Financial Policy and Purchasing Guidelines.

DISCUSSION:

The City's Public Works Department is responsible for the maintenance and repair of roadways owned by the City of New Port Richey. The application of roadway markings or striping is a part of the maintenance activities. The City's current maintenance program calls for striping of roadways every five to seven years. As Council is aware, Main Street from Congress Street to US Hwy 19 is the maintenance responsibility of the City. Subsequent to staff review, it has been determined this portion of Main Street meets the guidelines set for roadway marking maintenance and upgrades.

This proposed project will grind existing markings where needed, remove and replace existing raise pavement markers, and upgrade markings where needed in accordance with the current FDOT Florida Design Standards. The City's Construction Management Division has reviewed line item totals and verified references supplied by the contractor.

RECOMMENDATION:

In addition to all other legal remedies available to Pasco County, Pasco County reserves the right to cancel and obtain from another source, any services which have not been provided within the required period of time or, if no such time is stated, within a reasonable period of time from the date of order or request, as determined by Pasco County.

CERTIFICATION OF INDEPENDENT PRICE DETERMINATION

The bidder certifies that the prices submitted in response to the solicitation have been arrived at independently and without—for the purpose of restricting competition—any consultation, communication, or agreement with any other bidder or competitor relating to those prices, the intention to submit a bid, or the methods or factors used to calculate the prices bid.

CHANGE IN SCOPE OF WORK

Pasco County may order changes in the work consisting of additions, deletions, or other revisions within the general scope of the contract. No claims may be made by the contractor that the scope of the project or of the contractor's services has been changed, requiring changes to the amount of compensation to the contractor or other adjustments to the contract, unless such changes or adjustments have been made by written amendment to the contract or purchase order signed by Purchasing Director. If the contractor believes that any particular work is not within the scope of the project, is a material change, or will otherwise require more compensation to the contractor, the contractor must immediately notify Pasco County in writing of this belief. If Pasco County believes that the particular work is within the scope of the contract as written, the contractor will be ordered to and shall continue with the work as changed and at the cost stated for the work within the scope.

COLLUSION AMONG BIDDERS

Each bidder, by submitting a bid, certifies that it is not a party to any collusive action or any action that may be in violation of the Sherman Antitrust Act. Any or all bids shall be rejected if there is any reason for believing that collusion exists among the bidders. Pasco County may or may not, at its discretion, accept future bids for the same work from participants in such collusion. More than one (1) bid from an individual, firm, partnership, cooperation, or association under the same or different names may be rejected. Reasonable grounds for believing that a bidder has interest in more than one (1) bid for the work being bid may result in rejection of all bids in which the bidder is believed to have interest. Nothing in this clause shall preclude a firm acting as a subcontractor to be included as a subcontractor for two (2) or more primary contractors submitting a bid for the work.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The contractor, by submission of its proposal, certifies that to the best of his/her knowledge or belief, no elected/appointed official or employee of Pasco County is financially interested, directly or indirectly, in the offer of goods or services specified in this invitation.

DEBARMENT

By submitting a bid, the bidder certifies that it is not currently debarred from submitting bids for contracts issued by any political subdivision or agency of the State of Florida and that it is not an agent of a person or entity that is currently debarred from submitting bids for contracts issued by any subdivision or agency of the State of Florida.

ERRORS IN EXTENSIONS

If the unit price and the extension price are at variance, the unit price shall prevail.

ETHICS IN PUBLIC PROCUREMENT

The contract shall incorporate by reference, but shall not be limited to, the provisions of law contained in Chapter 112, Florida Statutes. A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity; may not submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work; may not submit bids on leases or real property to a public entity; may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity; and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 287.017, Florida Statutes, for CATEGORY TWO for a period of thirty-six (36) months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list. The bidder certifies that its bid was made without collusion or fraud; that it has not offered or received any kickbacks or inducements from any other bidder, supplier, manufacturer, or subcontractor in connection with this bid; and that it has not

EXCEPTIONS

Bidders taking exception to any part or section of the solicitation shall indicate such exceptions on the bid form or appendix. Failure to indicate any exception will be interpreted as the bidder's intent to comply fully with the minimum requirements as written. Conditional or qualified bids, unless specifically allowed, shall be subject to rejection in whole or in part.

EXPENSES INCURRED IN PREPARING BID

Pasco County accepts no responsibility for any expense incurred by the bidder in the preparation and presentation of a bid. Such expenses shall be borne exclusively by the bidder.

FAILURE TO DELIVER

In the event of failure of the contractor to deliver the goods and services in accordance with the contract terms and conditions, Pasco County may procure the goods and services from other sources and hold the contractor responsible for any resulting additional costs. A failure to deliver will result in immediate termination of a resulting contract, and immediate disqualification and debarment from submitting bids to Pasco County for a maximum of three (3) years. These remedies shall be in addition to any other remedies that Pasco County may have available.

FAILURE TO ENFORCE

Failure by Pasco County at any time to enforce the provisions of the contract shall not be construed as a waiver of any such provisions. Such failure to enforce shall not affect the validity of the contract or any part thereof or the right of Pasco County to enforce any provision at any time in accordance with its terms.

FAIR LABOR STANDARDS

By submission of a bid, the bidder certifies that the contractor(s) and/or subcontractor(s) providing product(s) or service(s) shall, in the execution or performance of such a contract, maintain fair labor standards as defined in applicable State and Federal regulations.

FORCE MAJEURE

The contractor shall not be held responsible for failure to perform the duties and responsibilities imposed by the contract due to legal strikes, fires, riots, rebellions, and acts of God beyond the control of the contractor, unless otherwise specified in the contract.

IDENTICAL BIDS

Identical bids or bids which otherwise appear suspicious will be reported to the County Attorney for investigation.

INDEMNIFICATION

In consideration of the sum of Fifteen and 00/100 Dollars (\$15.00), the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged by the contractor to be included and paid for in the contract price, the contractor shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Pasco County and its agents and employees from and against all liabilities, claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from the performance of the work, provided that any such liability, claim, damage, loss, or expense: (1) is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease or death, or to injury to or destruction of tangible property (other than the work itself), including the loss of use resulting therefrom; and (2) is caused in whole or in part by any negligent act or omission of the contractor and subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly

In any and all claims against Pasco County or any of its agents or employees by any employee of the contractor, any subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, the indemnification obligation under the previous paragraph shall not be limited in any way as to the amount or type of damages, compensation, or benefits payable by or for the contractor or any subcontractor under Workers' Compensation Acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts.

INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

The contractor shall be legally considered an independent contractor and neither the contractor nor its employees shall, under any circumstances, be considered servants or agents of Pasco County; and Pasco County shall be at no time legally responsible for any negligence or other wrongdoing by the contractor, its servants, or agents. Pasco County shall not withhold from the contractor any Federal or State unemployment taxes, Federal or State income taxes, Social Security tax, or any other amounts for benefits to the contractor. Further, Pasco County shall not provide to the contractor any insurance coverage or other benefits, including workers' compensation, normally provided by Pasco County for its employees.

INFORMALITIES AND IRREGULARITIES

Pasco County has the right to waive minor defects or variations of a bid from the exact requirements of the specifications that do not affect the price, quality, quantity, delivery, or performance time of the services being procured. If insufficient information is submitted by a bidder with the bid for Pasco County to properly evaluate the bid, Pasco County has the right to require such additional information as it may deem necessary after the time set for receipt of bids, provided that the information requested does not change the price, quality, quantity, delivery, or performance time of the services being procured. Pasco County reserves the right to reject any or all bids in whole or in part; to award by any item, group(s) of items, total bid, or accept the bid that is most advantageous and in the best interest of Pasco County.

LAW COMPLIANCE

Each party will comply with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations, and guidelines related to performance under this agreement. In particular, the contractor/vendor/named party verifies and affirms that it is in compliance with 8 U.S.C., Sec. 1324, prohibiting the employment either directly or by contract, subcontract, or exchange of unauthorized aliens in the United States. The County will consider the employment of unauthorized aliens by any contractor/vendor/named party, during the term of the agreement, a violation of the Immigration and Nationality Act. Such violation shall be cause for unilateral cancellation of this agreement by the County.

LIMITATION OF COST

The contractor agrees to perform the work specified and complete all obligations under the contract within the stated amounts.

NONAPPROPRIATION

All funds for payment by Pasco County under this contract are subject to the availability of an annual appropriation for this purpose by Pasco County. In the event of nonappropriation of funds by Pasco County for the services provided under the contract, Pasco County will terminate the contract, without termination charge or other liability, on the last day of the then-current fiscal year or when the appropriation made for the then-current year for the services covered by this contract is spent, whichever event occurs first. If at any time funds are not appropriated for the continuance of this contract, cancellation shall be accepted by

-8-(Solicitation No. IFB-DL-15-125) the contractor on thirty (30) days' prior written notice, but failure to give such notice shall be of no effect, and Pasco County shall not be obligated under this contract beyond the date of termination.

NONCONFORMING TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A bid response that includes terms and conditions that do not conform to the terms and conditions in the bid document is subject to rejection as nonresponsive. Pasco County reserves the right to permit the bidder to withdraw nonconforming terms and conditions from its bid response prior to a determination by Pasco County of nonresponsiveness based on the submission of nonconforming terms and conditions.

NONDISCRIMINATION

By submission of bid, the bidder certifies that the contractor(s) and/or subcontractor(s) providing product(s) or service(s) shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment, to be employed in the performance of such contract, with respect to his/her hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment, because of his/her race, color, religion, sex, disability, or national origin, as outlined in applicable State and Federal regulations.

ORAL STATEMENTS

No oral statement of any person shall modify or otherwise affect the terms, conditions, or specifications stated in this contract. All modifications to the contract or purchase order must be made in writing by Pasco County.

OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS

Pasco County is not responsible for expenses incurred prior to award. Pasco County officially distributes solicitation documents through the Florida Online Bid System (www.FloridaBidSystem.com). Solicitation documents may be downloaded at NO COST using this system and may also be obtained from the Purchasing Department in accordance with Florida Statutes that pertain to Public Records. Copies of solicitation documents obtained from other sources are not considered official and should not be relied upon. Pasco County is not responsible for solicitation documents obtained from sources other than the Florida Online Bid System or the Purchasing Department. Only vendors who properly register and obtain solicitation documents directly from the Florida Online Bid System or Purchasing Department will receive addenda and other important information if issued. Vendors are responsible for acquiring knowledge of changes, modifications, or additions to official solicitation documents. Vendors who submit responses and later claim they did not receive complete documents or had no knowledge of any changes, modifications, or additions made to the official solicitation documents shall still be bound by the solicitation, including any changes, modifications, or additions to the official solicitation documents. PUBLIC INFORMATION

Upon public opening of all bids or proposals presented to Pasco County as a result of this solicitation, any and all information contained therein is considered public and may be reviewed by any persons interested in doing so.

PURCHASE ORDER REQUIREMENT

Purchases of Pasco County are authorized only if a signed purchase order issued in advance of the transaction, showing that the ordering agency has sufficient funds available to pay for the service. Contractors providing services without a signed purchase order do so at their own risk. Pasco County will not be liable for payment for any services provided under the contract unless a valid purchase order has been issued to the contractor.

QUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDERS

The bidder may be required before the award of any contract to show to the complete satisfaction of Pasco County that it has the necessary facilities, ability, and financial resources to provide the service specified therein in a satisfactory manner. The bidder may also be required to give a past history and references in order to satisfy Pasco County in regard to the bidder's qualifications. Pasco County may make reasonable investigations deemed necessary and proper to determine the ability of the bidder to perform the work, and the bidder shall furnish to Pasco County all information for this purpose that may be requested. Pasco County reserves the right to reject any bid if the evidence submitted by, or investigation of, the bidder fails to satisfy Pasco County that the bidder is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to complete the work described therein. Evaluation of the bidder's qualifications shall include:

QUALITY OF GOODS

All goods shall be new, in first class condition, and of the manufacturer's latest design of the model presently in production. All materials, supplies, and equipment furnished or services performed under the terms of this purchase order or contractual agreement shall comply with the requirements and standards specified in the Williams-Steiger Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (Public Law 91-596), as well as other applicable Federal, State, and local codes. Equipment and materials furnished by the bidder having serious defects, corrosion, or scratches which tend to present an "other than new" appearance shall be promptly replaced or such defects promptly corrected by the bidder at no cost to Pasco County. Any existing Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) for the products, materials, supplies, or equipment being bid must be submitted with the bid. No product containing asbestos, lead paint, or polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) in any form will be considered for award by Pasco County.

RECOVERY OF MONEY

Whenever, under the contract, any sum of money shall be recoverable from or payable by the contractor to Pasco County, the same amount may be deducted from any sum due the contractor under the contract or under any other contract between the contractor and Pasco County. The rights of Pasco County are in addition and without prejudice to any other right Pasco County may have to claim the amount of any loss or damage suffered by Pasco County on account of the acts or omissions of the contractor.

RIGHT TO AUDIT

The contractor shall maintain such financial records and other records as they relate to the purchase of goods and/or services by Pasco County from the subject vendor. The contractor shall retain these records for a period of three (3) years after final payment, or until they are audited by Pasco County, whichever event occurs first. RISK OF LOSS

The bidder/contractor shall not be responsible for damage to the goods occasioned by negligence of Pasco County or its employees.

TABULATIONS

Solicitation results (tabulations) will not be given over the telephone or via fax.

TAXES

All bids shall be submitted exclusive of direct Federal, State, and local taxes; however, if the bidder believes certain taxes are properly payable, he/she may list such taxes separately in each case directly below the respective item bid price. Prices quoted must be in units specified, and shall not include the cost of any such taxes, including those on any material, supplies, or equipment used or installed in the work. 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UNSATISFACTORY WORK

If, at any time during the contract term, the service performed or work done by the contractor is considered by Pasco County to create a condition that threatens the health, safety, or welfare of the community, the contractor shall, on being notified by Pasco County, immediately correct such deficient service or work. In the event the contractor fails, after notice, to correct the deficient service or work immediately, Pasco County shall have the right to order the correction of the deficiency by separate contract or with its own resources at the expense of the contractor. Notwithstanding the above, Pasco County reserves the right to cancel a resulting contract, without cause, by giving thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the contractor of the intention to cancel.

END OF GENERAL PROVISIONS

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

In addition to the General Provisions of this solicitation, these Special Provisions, along with the specifications that follow, apply in like force to this solicitation and to any subsequent contract resulting therefrom.

CONTRACT TERM

The contract period will begin on October 1, 2015, and continue through September 30, 2018, under the same prices, terms, and conditions as in the original contract approved by Pasco County, unless canceled in writing by Pasco County. All contracts are subject to the appropriation of funds by Pasco County.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The insurance required must be written by an insurer authorized to do business in the State of Florida and also have an "A" policyholder's rating and a financial rating of at least Class VIII in accordance with the most current Best's Key Rating Guide. Prior to the time the contractor is entitled to commence any part of the project, work, or services under this contract, the contractor shall procure, pay for, and maintain at least the following insurance coverages and limits. The said insurance shall be evidenced by delivery to Pasco County of (1) Certificates of Insurance executed by the insurers listing coverages and limits, expiration dates and terms of policies and all endorsements whether or not required by Pasco County, and listing all carriers issuing the said policies; and (2) upon request, a certified copy of each policy, including all endorsements. The insurance requirements shall remain in effect throughout the term of this contract.

- 1. <u>Workers' Compensation</u> in at least the limits as required by law; <u>Employers' Liability Insurance</u> of not less than One Hundred Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$100,000.00) for each accident. The contractor agrees to waive its right of subrogation as part of this coverage.
- 2. Comprehensive General Liability Insurance including, but not limited to, Independent, Contractor, Contractual, Premises/Operations, Products/Completed Operation and Personal Injury covering the liability assumed under indemnification provisions of this contract, with limits of liability for personal injury and/or bodily injury, including death, of not less than Two Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$2,000,000.00), each occurrence; and property damage of not less than One Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), each occurrence. (Combined single limits of not less than Two Million and 00/100 Dollars [\$2,000,000.00], each occurrence, will be acceptable unless otherwise stated.) Coverage shall be on an "occurrence" basis, and the policy shall include Broad Form Property Damage coverage and Fire Legal Liability of not less than Fifty Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$50,000.00) per occurrence, unless otherwise stated by exception herein.
- Comprehensive Automobile and Truck liability covering owned, hired, and nonowned vehicles with combined single limits of not less than One Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), each occurrence. Coverage shall be on an "occurrence" basis, such insurance to include coverage for loading and unloading hazards.

Each insurance policy shall include the following conditions by endorsement to the policy:

Each policy shall require that thirty (30) days prior to expiration, cancellation, nonrenewal, or any
material change in coverages or limits, a notice thereof shall be given to Pasco County by certified

- Companies issuing the insurance policy, or policies, shall have no recourse against Pasco County

- 3. The term "County" or "Pasco County" shall include all Authorities, Boards, Bureaus, Commissions, Divisions, Departments, and Offices of County and individual members, employees thereof in their official capacities, and/or while acting on behalf of Pasco County.
- 4. Pasco County shall be endorsed to the required policy or policies as an additional named insured.
- 5. The policy clause "Other Insurance" shall not apply to any insurance coverage currently held by Pasco County to any such future coverage, or to Pasco County's self-insured retentions of whatever nature.

REQUIREMENTS CONTRACT

During the period of the contract, the contractor shall provide all the services described in the contract. The contractor understands and agrees this is a requirements contract and Pasco County shall have no obligation to the contractor if no services are required. Any quantities that are included in the scope of work reflect the current expectations of Pasco County for the period of the contract. The amount is only an estimate, and the contractor understands and agrees Pasco County is under no obligation to the contractor to buy any amount of the services as a result of having provided this estimate or of having any typical or measurable requirement in the past. The contractor further understands and agrees Pasco County may require services in an amount less than or in excess of the estimated annual contract amount, and the quantity actually used, whether in excess of the estimate or less than the estimate, shall not give rise to any claim for compensation other than the total of the unit prices in the contract for the quantity actually used.

TRAFFIC CONTROL

The contractor shall conduct its operations in a manner that will not interrupt pedestrian or vehicle traffic except as approved by Pasco County. The work area shall be confined to the smallest area possible to allow maximum use of the street or sidewalk and to reduce any hazard to traffic or pedestrians to a minimum. At all times, the contractor shall use workers and traffic control signs and devices necessary to comply with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws, rules, and regulations. In addition to signs and devices, when the street is obstructed to any extent by contract operations, special workers equipped with flags shall be designated by the contractor to direct vehicle and pedestrian traffic. The workers so designated shall not be assigned to any other duties while engaged in directing traffic. All personnel, signs, barricades, and any other items or devices necessary for the maintenance of traffic and safety shall be provided by the contractor. No separate payment shall be made by Pasco County for this work. All cost of this work is included by the contractor as part of the contract price. The plan for traffic control shall be as directed by Pasco County. A Right-of-Way Use Permit shall be obtained from Pasco County prior to the commencement of any work in such a right-of-way.

TRANSPORTATION AND PACKING

Prices quoted shall be net, including transportation and delivery charges fully prepaid by the seller, f.o.b. various locations throughout Pasco County, Florida. No additional charges will be allowed for packing, packages, or partial delivery costs. By submitting their bids, all bidders certify and warrant that the price offered for f.o.b. destination includes only the actual freight rate costs at the lowest and best rate and is

- I. Work to be accomplished is the installation of pavement markings on various roads within Pasco County. All markings shall be installed in accordance with all current Florida Department of Transportation Specifications Sections 701, 706, 710, 711, 713 and the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. Markings installation shall be installed under one of the classifications in Section III.
- II. The work shall constitute installation of the following approximate quantities of paint, thermoplastic standard, thermoplastic refurbished and preformed pavement markings and other items as listed below. Actual quantities of pavement markings may vary due to field conditions. The contract price shall be based on the estimated quantities and units of measure of the following items.

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III. Markings Classification

Class I, Maintenance Thermoplastic Restriping:

The Pasco County Public Works Department shall issue a written notice to proceed for each road to be striped in accordance with section IV-D. Maintenance restriping shall be directed by the Pasco County Public Works Department without plans. All markings shall be reinstalled per the existing patterns or revised patterns. When patterns are to be revised or existing pattern can not be determined, the pattern shall be determined by the Traffic Operations Division and layout will be provided by the Public Works Department. Existing 4" markings shall be replaced with 6" markings per Florida Department of Transportation standards.

Class II, Maintenance Paint Restriping:

See Class I

Class III, New Thermoplastic Pavement Markings:

The Pasco County Traffic Operations Division shall direct new pavement markings installation with plans provided by the Traffic Operations Division.

The Traffic Operations Division shall issue a written notice to proceed in accordance with section IV-D for each road to be striped. The Contractor shall call the Pasco County Traffic Operations Division 727-847-8139 no less then 48 hours prior to layout of the markings on each road to arrange for inspection prior to thermoplastic installation. The Traffic Operations Division will direct the contractor to make any field adjustments to the layout as required. Upon completion of the installation, the Traffic Operations Division will inspect the installation.

IV. Conditions

- A. Contractor shall at his cost replace, restore or repair any County property or private property damaged or disturbed during marking installation.
- B. Maintenance of traffic during pavement marking installation shall be in accordance with the appropriate Florida Department of Transportation Standard Index (600 series). Failure to provide proper maintenance of traffic will result in striping operations being shut down until proper maintenance of traffic is provided. The following lane closure restrictions apply; lane closures on any collector or arterial roadway shall not be permitted during the hours of 6AM to 9AM and 4PM to 7PM. Lane closures within any school zone or within 500 feet of a school zone shall not be permitted from 1 hour before to 1 hour after the starting and ending times for the school.
- C. Within ten (10) working days upon receipt of the Purchase Order, the contractor shall submit the Traffic Control Devices Submittal Form for approval. The Traffic Operations Division shall review the Traffic Control Devices Submittal Form. Upon approval of the Traffic Control Devices Submittal Form an approved copy will be returned to the contractor. Should at any

-18-(Solicitation No. IFB-DL-15-125) time during the contract time, the contractor desires to change any manufacturer of materials, a new Traffic Control Devices Submittal Form shall be submitted for approval of that materials.

- D. An emailed notice to proceed for each road or project will be issued as outlined in section II. The contractor shall designate two employees to be the contacts for the emailed notice to proceed. Upon receipt of the notice to proceed, employees shall acknowledge the receipt of the notice to proceed within two working days. Plans when required shall be provided with the notice to proceed in PDF format. The contractor shall start work within fourteen (14) working days of receipt of each notice to proceed. Each road shall be completed within thirty days from the actual start date.
- E. It shall be the responsibility of the contractor to ensure that the pavement is clean and free of dirt, debris or water that would prevent proper adhesion of markings to the pavement.
- F. Failure to comply with contract conditions shall be considered a breach of contract. The contractor shall be notified, in writing, of the specific deficiencies and given seven (7) working days to effect appropriate corrective action. Failure to make corrections within specified period or repeated non-performance of contract conditions may, at the County's option result in termination of the contract.
- G. Pasco County reserves the right to terminate this contract, with or without cause, upon 30 days written notice to the contractor.

V. Payment:

A. Payment for the work outlined above shall be made under the Florida Department of Transportation pay items listed under section II.

The price for all pay items above shall be full compensation for the work (labor & materials) described above and for any incidental costs, such as mobilization, cleaning of pavement, layout, changes in layout as directed by Pasco County and maintenance of traffic.

B. Request for payment shall be submitted for each road separately to the department issuing the notice to proceed. The request shall be submitted within 10 days of completion of each road. The request for payment shall include an itemized list for each project by pay item per the list above. Requests shall be processed for payment no later than five working days after receipt by the issuing department. Payment will be made upon approval by the Board of County Commissioners.

Nonprofit civic organizations shall: 1) Have tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) or (6) of the 1986 IRS Code; 2) Operate an office in the City or be a nationally-recognized organization that conducted business as a nonprofit in the City; and 3) Promote or stimulate community and economic development within the City.
- 5. Only beer and wine shall be permitted to be served. The proposed sales and/or consumption activity must be associated with a public event. Alcoholic beverages shall be served in plastic containers only. No cans or glass containers shall be permitted.
- 6. Access points of the serving area shall be marked with signs notifying palrons that alcoholic beverages are not to be taken past the perimeter of the area shown on the site plan, and the applicant shall staff the entrance with as many personnel as necessary to enforce this requirement.
- 7. The proposed sales and/or consumption activity will not unreasonably interfere with or detract from the promotion of public health, welfare, safety and recreation. It will also not entail extraordinary or burdensome expense or police operation by the City. The use of alcoholic beverages is not expected to result in violence, crime or disorderly conduct.
- 8. The consumption and possession of alcoholic beverages upon a public street may be permitted as part of a special event subject to other conditions. No permits will be issued for special events within any City parkt except Sims Park, Orange Lake Park or Cavalier Square.
- 9. The sale, possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be confined to designated and secured areas. The perimeter of the designated area shall be secured for the entire event. 
