RE: WWTP Pump Purchase

Robert,

As you know we budgeted to purchase a 6 inch portable pump for this fiscal year. Please find attached all the required documents.

This pump will improve our response to emergencies and reduce maintenance downtime because it's much larger than any other portable pump that we have here at the plant. The largest portable pump we have here can only pump 200 gpm which is adequate for some needs but far too small for emergencies. Some of our tanks hold millions of gallons. Specific uses of the pump would include draining tanks for maintenance and emergency repair, for by-pass pumping around different processes that may have lost electricity or have pump problems. And to help minimize any spills that may occur. Having a portable pump here on site will substantially improve response time. It comes with sound proofing and automatic controls for unattended use.

This is a planned and budgeted expense. As noted on the Requisition Request the City will take advantage of the Florida Sheriffs State contract price for this purchase.

Pasco County will be contributing 40% of the cost for the pump as outlined in our interlocal agreement.
