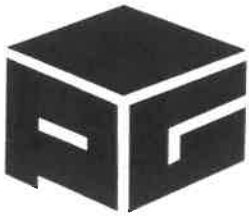

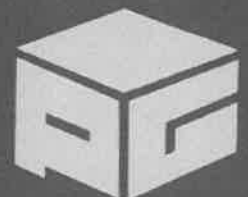

Ryan then went on to co-found The Boardr in 2013. Since its inception, Ryan has been behind-the-scenes at events ranging from backyard mini-ramp jams and art shows, to full scale live television broadcasts.

Rob: Media Administration

Rob Meronek is a software engineer, Certified Public Accountant, and photographer with over 25 years invested into skateboarding. He was born in the Philippines, and started skating in upstate New York, where skateboarding went from childhood toy to lifelong dream. He started working at Skatepark of Tampa in 2001. He wrote their custom POS system and on-line retail store, one of the first live inventory websites in the industry at the time. After parting ways with SPoT in 2013, he joined back up with Ryan Clements to create The Boardr, a new agency with a new vision and approach to how skateboarding events are organized and run. With that came the development of "The Boardr Live," an innovative scoring app that is now used by event organizers around the world to handle every task necessary in running a proper skateboard contest.



Project Understanding

Background

- The existing New Port Richey skatepark was originally built in 2002. It contains outdated above-ground features that have since fallen apart and are beyond repair. The City is looking to explore options to replace the skatepark features with a modern skatepark that will carry less maintenance, is safer, and has a longer lifespan than the current facility.

Observations

- Our team visited the site and noticed that the site is uniquely able to accommodate a concrete skatepark in its design without having to do intense grading work, which is usually typical of Florida skateparks. The large retention pond to the south of the skatepark would allow for work to seamlessly fit within the grade. The result will be a budget-friendly opportunity to include a bowl structure if the community deems it a priority. We will show you all of the possibilities at the Kickoff Meeting.

Scene

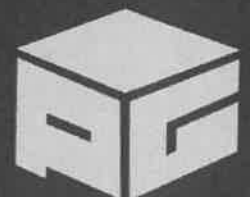
- The general area and its surroundings are lacking in facilities that meet the needs of the community. This skatepark will naturally serve an area much larger than New Port Richey itself. Although it is currently a community size skatepark, we are confident that it will become a destination, attracting visitors from all parts of Florida and beyond. We will create the design to complement the aesthetics of the entire facility. The end product will fit in seamlessly at the park.

Demographics

- The facility must cater to not only skateboards, but also bikes, scooters, and inline skates as well. Our target demographic is 7 to 17-year-olds (14yo median age). Our team is very familiar with the region and needs of both street and transition disciplines. The plan is to use a public input process, online survey, and data to prioritize what will be in the best interest of the community. Our shared vision is to create a facility that engages and challenges the users of today and those of tomorrow, so that your park is fun for the foreseeable future and does not become obsolete.

Planning and Funding

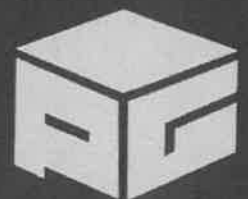
- Along the entire process, we will consider budgeting and prioritizing either a "full build" or "phase build" approach based on the City's funding. Our team plans to repurpose and reuse any elements deemed worthy of keeping, such as light posts, fences, landscaping, and possibly portions of the skatepark slab. We intend to apply value engineering methods to every step of the project.
- Since there are future renovation plans for the basketball courts that neighbor the park, we will use our schematic design to kick start that exploration as well to show the vision of the general area.
- The Construction Documents will be stamped and signed by a licensed Florida engineer. We assume that some sort of modification or permit will be needed for SWFWMD depending upon the final design. What is required is unknown at this time, therefore our team has not included these costs in our bid.



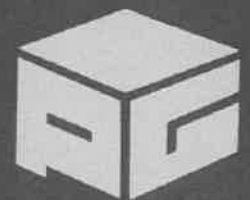

- The town of East Hampton, NY had a legendary Andy Kessler-designed skatepark that was constructed in 1998. The town had a coalition of veteran surfers/skaters in charge of the skatepark's vision. They invited a handful of companies to propose their ideas of the park with a challenge to maintain the history of the original park, and also work with the coalition as they fundraised to an unknown amount. Tito Porrata, working with Pivot Custom at the time, was selected as the main designer of the skatepark.

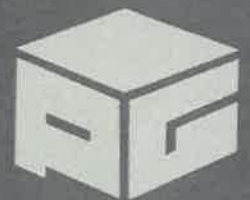

Synopsis:

- Lot 11 is being referred to as one of the best skateparks in the world! We worked to design the 43,000sf skatepark under Interstate 95 to transform an underutilized parking lot operated by the Miami Parking Authority. The project was funded by the MPA and donations gathered by SkateFree.org. The design included using basalt reinforcement (non-steel sustainable product) in 95% of the park. Additional unique materials used included Geofoam, recycled concrete, and recycled asphalt as sub-base to minimize material export and import during construction.

Synopsis:

- The City of Easthampton, Massachusetts Planning Department put out a request for design services with the goals to assess site suitability, bike trail expansions, and design development of a new skatepark. With many site challenges such as neighboring ponds and the easements of facilities in close proximity, the solutions we proposed earned Platform the award for this project. Our team surveyed nearby skateparks, met with the City and stakeholders, and created a concept to engage the local community and provide a final design that addresses all the challenges. The City will use the plans and data collected from this process to apply for grants to fulfill the construction of the skatepark.

Pre-Planning and Discovery

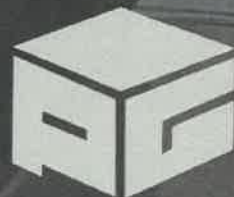

Community input is where the design begins to take shape! - **Meeting 2:** Present the ideas generated by the stakeholders and receive one final round of feedback and input. Conduct a presentation of the final skatepark design and estimated costs.
- **Online portal:** Survey and the final results of meetings will be placed online for further comment until the municipality is satisfied.



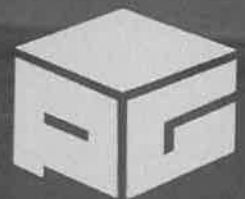

Planning and Construction Documents

We will identify what is specialty work and what is general work so we can maximize local involvement. Our team will practice value engineering at every level to assure that the skatepark's budget is best spent. These services will include:

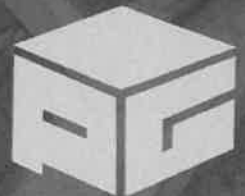
- Develop construction documents with progress reviews at 30%, 60%, and 90% for the skatepark plans, including written specifications.
- Work with the client to consider necessary skatepark support features. These could include:
 - Conceptual landscaping design

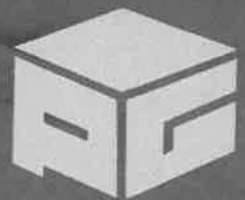
